

Carlo Batini is the president of the Italian Authority for Information Technologies in the Public Administration. He has been a full professor at University of Roma "La Sapienza" since 1986. His main research area has been database design methodologies, both in their theoretical aspects and in their applications. Recently his research interests have been turned to cooperative information systems.

Fynnette Eaton recently joined the Electronic Records Archives Program at the National Archives and Records Administration. From 1997 to 2002 she served as Director of the Technical Services Division within the Smithsonian Institution Archives. She received the IAC/IRM Technology Excellence Award in 1996 for designing the Archival Preservation System at NARA.

Stephan Heuscher has recently joined the Archival of Electronic Data project at the Swiss Federal Archives. He received his MSc in Information Technology and Electrical Engineering at the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology Zurich in 1999. From 1999 to 2002 he acquired XML knowledge by working in several industry projects.

Giovanni Michetti, research assistant at the Scuola speciale per archivisti e bibliotecari of the University of Rome "La Sapienza", teaches courses on analysis and management of electronic records at the University of Urbino. He works as consultant for the Scuola superiore della pubblica amministrazione in the area of electronic recordkeeping systems and cooperates with the Ministry for Finance in planning the classification systems for the digital environment. He is also one of the Erpanet content editors.

Reagan Moore is Co-Program Manager for Data and Knowledge Systems at the San Diego Supercomputer Center and an Adjunct Professor in the UCSD CSE Department. Moore leads SDSC involvement in projects with NARA on persistent archives, NSF on NSDL persistent archives, NASA Information Power Grid, NIH on Biomedical Informatics Research Network, and data management for the Library of Congress.

Maureen Potter joined the Digital Preservation Testbed project in the Netherlands as Experiment Operator early in 2001. Her work on the Testbed project includes running and evaluating experiments, contributing to experiment design, and maintaining the Testbed research database.

Andreas Rauber is currently an ERCIM Research Fellow at INRIA, France. A member of the Academic Faculty at the Department of Software Technology at the Vienna University of Technology since 1997, he received the OeGAI award of the Austrian Society for Artificial Intelligence in 1998. He has published over 60 papers in refereed journals and international conferences and is actively involved in numerous research projects in the field of Digital Libraries.

Enrico Rendina is the director of the Centro MAAS – Consorzio Roma Ricerche, engaged in the research area concerned with IT methods for management of archival sources. The main projects realized include ASEI (Archivio Storico Elettronico Iri), the automation of the Guida generale degli Archivi di Stato italiani (through the use of SGML technology), "Labirinti" related to the development of interoperability functions for archival description in the digital environment
